

#### Love Takes Work

If you believed your own natural death was imminent, would that affect the decisions you make? When St. Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, that was his expectation- that the Lord's return was going to take place quickly, that the Second Coming was just about to occur and could happen at any time.

While St. Paul writes to the Corinthians that it is better to be unmarried than married, the purpose of this advice is to keep life simple and focused on what is important. Don't make any long-term commitments like buying a field, or starting a business, or even getting married. Be ready and prepared because the end of the world could literally be tomorrow. "I should like you to be free of anxieties," he wrote. Much later, St. Paul realized the end was not going to happen as soon as originally expected.

Saint Paul was not against marriage. He would be the first to say that, ideally, marriage can and often does reveal the depths of human love, but he would also say that it takes work; it doesn't happen all by itself. Just as readily, St. Paul would also note that, ideally, celibacy can and often does reveal the breadth of love given in service to others, whether the celibate person is lay, a priest, or a religious. It can seem, however, that the unclean spirit that Jesus cast out continues to roam human lives. All of us struggle to live out love as best we can, wherever we find ourselves in life.

Si creyeras que tu propia muerte natural es inminente, ¿afectaría eso a las decisiones que tomas? Cuando San Pablo escribió a la iglesia de Corinto, ésa era su expectativa: que el regreso del Señor iba a tener lugar rápidamente, que la Segunda Venida estaba a punto de producirse y podía ocurrir en cualquier momento.

Aunque San Pablo escribe a los corintios que es mejor estar soltero que casado, el propósito de este consejo es mantener la vida sencilla y centrada en lo importante. No te comprometas a largo plazo, como comprar un campo, o montar un negocio, o incluso casarte. Estate listo y preparado porque el fin del mundo podría ser literalmente mañana. "Me gustaría que estuvierais libres de ansiedades", escribió. Mucho más tarde, San Pablo se dio cuenta de que el fin no iba a suceder tan pronto como se esperaba en un principio.

San Pablo no estaba en contra del matrimonio. Sería el primero en decir que, idealmente, el matrimonio puede revelar, y a menudo revela, las profundidades del amor humano, pero también diría que requiere trabajo; no sucede por sí solo. Con la misma facilidad, San Pablo también señalaría que, idealmente, el celibato puede revelar, y a menudo lo hace, la amplitud del amor entregado al servicio de los demás, tanto si la persona célibe es laica como si es sacerdote o religiosa. Sin embargo, puede parecer que el espíritu impuro que Jesús expulsó sigue vagando por las vidas humanas. Todos luchamos por vivir el amor lo mejor que podemos, dondequiera que nos encontremos en la vida.
