


Transfigurations in a Mutilated World

I've never met anyone who thought today's story in Genesis of Abraham and Isaac to be a good story. Abhorred, they ask, "Why would God test someone by asking him to sacrifice his son?" But what if we change the question and ask, "Why would the Hebrew people include that story in their most holy writings? Why would they tell it over and over?" Because of the ending- that's why. Like a movie we watch over and over even thought we know how it ends, we watch it, in part, because the ending is satisfying.

The ending of the Abraham/Isaac story shows God is not interested in death and human sacrifice, contrary to the gods of that time. The God of the Hebrews is a God of Life- that's the surprise ending they love, and they keep telling it over and over lest they forget. For them, the part about the testing is simply a means to that unbelievable ending when God insists upon life, contrary to false gods.

In his poem "Try to Praise the Mutilated World," Adam Zagajewski writes of life's Godly moments in a world we have mutilated by violence, greed, division, and more. He muses on tender moments when we fall in love, on laughter until our sides hurt, on nature's dazzle, on the sweet tasted of wine- all simple moments of a life-giving God transfigured in a mutilated world, for our God insists upon life.

Nunca he conocido a nadie que pensara que la historia de hoy en el Génesis de Abraham e Isaac fuera una buena historia. Aborrecidos, preguntan: "¿Por qué iba Dios a poner a prueba a alguien pidiéndole que sacrificara a su hijo?". Pero, ¿y si cambiamos la pregunta y preguntamos: "¿Por qué incluiría el pueblo hebreo esa historia en sus escritos más sagrados? ¿Por qué la contarían una y otra vez?". Por el final, por eso. Como una película que vemos una y otra vez aunque sabemos cómo acaba, la vemos, en parte, porque el final es satisfactorio.

El final de la historia de Abraham/Isaac muestra que a Dios no le interesan la muerte ni los sacrificios humanos, al contrario que a los dioses de aquella época. El Dios de los hebreos es un Dios de Vida: ése es el final sorpresa que les encanta, y lo repiten una y otra vez para no olvidarlo. Para ellos, la parte de la prueba es simplemente un medio para llegar a ese final increíble en el que Dios insiste en la vida, contrariamente a los falsos dioses.

En su poema "Intentar alabar el mundo mutilado", Adam Zagajewski escribe sobre los momentos divinos de la vida en un mundo que hemos mutilado por la violencia, la codicia, la división y otras cosas. Reflexiona sobre los momentos tiernos en que nos enamoramos, sobre la risa hasta que nos duelen los costados, sobre el deslumbramiento de la naturaleza, sobre el dulce sabor del vino: todos ellos momentos sencillos de un Dios dador de vida transfigurado en un mundo mutilado, pues nuestro Dios insiste en la vida.
